One of my favorites on the DVD, and one of the simplest, is an effect using a TT wherein the performer is seen to be chewing gum. He takes a wrapper and puts it to his mouth removing the chewed gum. Putting the wrapper into his fist, it has magically transformed into a brand new wrapped piece.

This is the perfect walk around trick. I've actually walked up to friends, chewing as loudly as I can, knowing that any second they're going to ask me for a piece. When they do, they can't believe their eyes. And I think this is one of the reasons that Jay's magic is so powerful. It involves items and ideas whereby you're using the spectator's thoughts against them. I've yet to have a spectator ask me for three soft Morgan dollars, but gum? Absolutely. And with Jay's help, I've got the magic covered. I really wanted to say "got the magic wrapped up", but it didn't have quite the same ring to it. ~ Duncan Richardson
